Individuals outside of the baronial zipcodes and non-members may mail comments to Their Majesties [or Highnesses] but may not receive official polling letters.

Please note that your response must be sent directly to Their Highnesses at the address below and NOT returned to me. An addressed, stamped envelope is enclosed for your convenience. Your polling response must be postmarked no later than January 17, 2009.

Pollings will be mailed by December 31, 2008.

January

- 1 630 - The [Prophet Muhammad](#) sets out toward [Mecca](#) with the army that captures it bloodlessly.
1001 - Grand Prince [Stephen I of Hungary](#) is named the first King of Hungary by [Pope Silvester II](#).
1438 - [Albert II of Habsburg](#) is crowned King of [Hungary](#).
1515 - [King Francis I](#) of [France](#) succeeds to the French throne.
1527 - Croatian nobles elect [Ferdinand I](#) of Austria as king of Croatia in the [Parliament on Cetin](#).
1600 - [Scotland](#) begins its numbered year on January 1 instead of March 25.
- 2 1492 - [Reconquista](#): the [emirate of Granada](#), the last [Moorish](#) stronghold in [Spain](#), surrenders.
- 3 1431 - [Joan of Arc](#) is handed over to the [Bishop Pierre Cauchon](#).
1496 - [Leonardo da Vinci](#) unsuccessfully tests a flying machine.
1521 - [Pope Leo X](#) excommunicates [Martin Luther](#) in the [papal bull Decet Romanum Pontificem](#).
- 4 1490 - [Anna of Brittany](#) announces that all those who would ally with the king of [France](#) will be considered guilty of the crime of [lese-majesty](#).
1493 - [Christopher Columbus](#) leaves the [New World](#), ending his first journey.
- 5 1477 - [Battle of Nancy](#): [Charles the Bold](#) is killed and [Burgundy](#) becomes part of [France](#).
1500 - Duke [Ludovico Sforza](#) conquers [Milan](#).
1527 - [Felix Manz](#), a leader of the [Anabaptist](#) congregation in [Zürich](#), is [executed](#) by [drowning](#).
- 6 1066 - [Harold Godwinson](#) is crowned King of [England](#).
1205 - [Philip of Swabia](#) becomes [King of the Romans](#).
1449 - Byzantine Emperor [Constantine XI](#) is crowned at [Mistra](#).
1494 - The first Mass in the [New World](#) is celebrated at [La Isabela, Hispaniola](#).
1540 - King [Henry VIII of England](#) marries [Anne of Cleves](#).
- 7 1325 - [Alfonso IV](#) becomes King of [Portugal](#).
1558 - [France](#) takes [Calais](#), the last continental possession of [England](#).
1598 - [Boris Godunov](#) becomes Tsar of [Russia](#).
- 8 1297 - [Monaco](#) gains its independence.
1499 - [Louis XII of France](#) marries [Anne of Brittany](#).
- 9 1349 - The Jewish population of [Basel, Switzerland](#), believed by the residents to be the cause of the ongoing [Black Death](#), is rounded up and incinerated.
1431 - Judges' investigations for the trial of [Joan of Arc](#) begin in [Rouen, France](#), the seat of the English occupation government.
- 10 1072 - [Robert Guiscard](#) conquers [Palermo](#).
1475 - [Stephen III of Moldavia](#) defeats the [Ottoman Empire](#) at the [Battle of Vaslui](#)
- 11 1055 - [Theodora](#) is crowned Empress of the [Byzantine Empire](#).
1569 - First recorded [lottery](#) in [England](#).
1571 - [Austrian](#) nobility is granted [freedom of religion](#).
- 12 1528 - [Gustav I of Sweden](#) crowned king of [Sweden](#).
1539 - Treaty of Toledo signed by King [Francis I of France](#) and [Holy Roman Emperor Charles V](#).
- 13 888 - [Odo, Count of Paris](#) becomes King of the [Franks](#).
1328 - [Edward III of England](#) marries [Philippa of Hainault](#), daughter of the [Count of Hainault](#).
1547 - [Henry Howard, Earl of Surrey](#) is sentenced to death.
- 14 1129 - Formal approval of the [Order of the Templar](#) at the [Council of Troyes](#)
1501 - [Martin Luther](#), age 17, enters the [University of Erfurt](#).
1514 - Pope [Leo X](#) issues a [papal bull](#) against [slavery](#).
1539 - [Spain](#) annexes [Cuba](#).
- 15 1559 - [Elizabeth I](#) crowned queen of England in Westminster Abbey, London.
1582 - [Russia](#) cedes [Livonia](#) and [Estonia](#) to [Poland](#).
- 16 550 - [Gothic War \(535–552\)](#): The [Ostrogoths](#), under King [Totila](#), conquer [Rome](#) after a long siege, by bribing the [Isaurian](#) garrison.
1120 - The [Council of Nablus](#) is held, establishing the earliest surviving written laws of the [Crusader Kingdom of Jerusalem](#)
1412 - The [Medici](#) family is appointed official banker of the [Papacy](#).

- 16 [1492](#) - The first [grammar](#) of a modern language, in the [Spanish language](#), is presented to Queen [Isabella](#).
[1547](#) - [Ivan IV of Russia](#) aka Ivan the Terrible becomes [Tsar](#) of [Russia](#).
[1556](#) - [Philip II](#) becomes King of [Spain](#).
[1572](#) - [Thomas Howard, 4th Duke of Norfolk](#) is tried for treason for his part in the [Ridolfi plot](#) to restore [Catholicism](#) in [England](#).
[1581](#) - The [English Parliament](#) outlaws [Roman Catholicism](#).
- 17 [1377](#) - [Pope Gregory XI](#) moves the Papacy back to [Rome](#) from [Avignon](#).
[1524](#) - Beginning of [Giovanni da Verrazzano's](#) voyage to find a passage to [China](#).
[1562](#) - [France](#) recognizes the [Huguenots](#) under the [Edict of Saint-Germain](#).
[1595](#) - [Henry IV of France](#) declares war on [Spain](#).
- 18 [1126](#) - [Emperor Huizong](#) abdicates the [Chinese](#) throne in favour of his son [Emperor Qinzong](#).
[1486](#) - [King Henry VII of England](#) marries [Elizabeth of York](#), daughter of [Edward IV](#).
[1520](#) - King [Christian II](#) of [Denmark](#) and [Norway](#) defeats the [Swedes](#) at Lake Åsunden.
[1562](#) - [Pope Pius IV](#) reopens the [Council of Trent](#) for its third and final session.
[1591](#) - King [Naresuan](#) of [Siam](#) kills Crown Prince Minchit Sra of [Burma](#) in [single combat](#), for which this date is now observed marked as [Royal Thai Armed Forces](#) day.
- 19 [1419](#) - [Hundred Years' War](#): [Rouen](#) surrenders to [Henry V of England](#) completing his reconquest of [Normandy](#).
[1520](#) - [Sten Sture the Younger](#), the [Regent of Sweden](#), was mortally wounded at the [Battle of Bogesund](#).
- 20 [1265](#) - In [Westminster](#), the first English [parliament](#) conducts its first meeting in the [Palace of Westminster](#), now also known as the "Houses of Parliament".
[1320](#) - Duke [Wladyslaw Lokietek](#) becomes king of [Poland](#).
[1356](#) - [Edward Balliol](#) abdicates as King of [Scotland](#).
[1523](#) - [Christian II](#) is forced to abdicate as King of [Denmark](#) and [Norway](#).
[1576](#) - The [Mexican](#) city of [León](#) is founded by order of the viceroy Don Martín Enríquez de Almansa.
- 21 [1189](#) - [Philip II of France](#) and [Richard I of England](#) begin to assemble troops to wage the [Third Crusade](#).
[1287](#) - The treaty of San Agayz is signed. [Minorca](#) is conquered by King [Alfons III of Aragon](#).
[1525](#) - The [Swiss Anabaptist](#) Movement is born when [Conrad Grebel](#), [Felix Manz](#), [George Blaurock](#), and about a dozen others baptize each other in the home of Manz's mother in [Zürich](#), breaking a thousand-year tradition of church-state union.
- 22 [1506](#) - The first contingent of 150 [Swiss Guards](#) arrive at the [Vatican](#).
[1521](#) - [Emperor Charles V](#) opens the [Diet of Worms](#).
- 23 [1368](#) - In a coronation ceremony, [Zhu Yuanzhang](#) ascends to the [throne of China](#) as the [Hongwu Emperor](#), initiating [Ming Dynasty](#) rule over [China](#) that would last for three centuries.
[1510](#) - [Henry VIII of England](#), then 18 years old, appears [incognito](#) in the [lists](#) at [Richmond](#), and is applauded for his jousting before he reveals his identity.
[1533](#) - [Anne Boleyn](#), second wife of Henry VIII of England, discovers herself pregnant.
[1556](#) - The deadliest [earthquake](#) in history, the [Shaanxi earthquake](#), hits [Shaanxi](#) province, [China](#). The death toll may have been as high as 830,000.
[1570](#) - The [assassination](#) of regent [James Stewart, 1st Earl of Moray](#) throws [Scotland](#) into [civil war](#).
[1571](#) - The [Royal Exchange](#) opens in [London](#).
- 25 [1327](#) - [Edward III](#) becomes King of [England](#).
[1494](#) - [Alfonso II](#) becomes King of [Naples](#).
[1533](#) - [Henry VIII of England](#) secretly marries his second wife [Anne Boleyn](#).
- 26 [1340](#) - [King Edward III of England](#) is declared [King of France](#).
[1564](#) - The [Council of Trent](#) issued its conclusions in the Tridentinum, establishing a distinction between [Roman Catholicism](#) and [Protestantism](#).
[1565](#) - [Battle of Talikota](#), fought between the [Vijayanagara Empire](#) and the [Islamic](#) sultanates of the [Deccan](#), leads to the subjugation, and eventual destruction of the last [Hindu](#) kingdom in [India](#), and the consolidation of Islamic rule over much of the [Indian subcontinent](#).
- 27 [1186](#) - [Henry VI](#), the son and heir of the [Holy Roman Emperor Frederick I](#), weds [Constance of Sicily](#).
- 28 [1521](#) - The [Diet of Worms](#) begins, lasting until [May 25](#).
[1547](#) - [Henry VIII](#) dies. His nine year old son, [Edward VI](#) becomes King, and the first [Protestant](#) ruler of [England](#).
- 29 [904](#) - [Sergius III](#) comes out of retirement to take over the [papacy](#) from the deposed [antipope Christopher](#).
- 31 [1504](#) - [France](#) cedes [Naples](#) to [Aragon](#).
